EarlyON Child and Family Centres are free programs located throughout Windsor-Essex County offering high quality, inclusive services supporting early learning and development. They are warm and welcoming. Children learn, play and engage in positive interactions with other children and adults. SFLC offer Indigenous culturally specific programming in our centres as well as providing in-Agency programming through Mobile Services and with Community Pop-Up events.

Parents and caregivers can enjoy their children and participate in:

Parent/Caregiver Workshops & Resources

- EarlyON Child and Family Centre (EarlyON CFC) community partners present and lead discussion groups, information session workshop series based on parent/caregiver requests at many EarlyON CFCs.
- Some examples include You Make the Difference (speech and language delay prevention series), Baby Massage, Toilet Learning, Sibling Rivalry, & many others.
- SFLC has culturally specific teachings available for parents and families. Our Indigenous Cultural Specialist is available to lend an ear and share teachings.

Pre and Postnatal Resources & Info

- Several EarlyONs house parent resource lending libraries providing information for pre/postnatal issues.
- Also, health care and child development professional are brought in to address group concerns and to discuss healthy child development during the early years, which is critical for long-term health and well-being.

Referrals and Linkages to Other Early Years and Community Services

- Learn about services related to health, libraries, recreation, schools & childcare.
- Referrals are available for children with special needs (e.g. infant hearing, blind/low vision, speech and language delays and other developmental delays)
- Referrals are available for other family supports (breast-feeding concerns, child care fee assistance, family counselling, special programs for fathers, etc.)



EarlyON Indigenous HUB

As the designated Indigenous HUB for the City of Windsor, our purpose is to support the children and families of our community in achieving their goals.

Ska:na focuses on Early Learning, child care services and healthy child development during a child's first years. SFLC offers space and meeting rooms for community service providers for inclusive, easy access services.

- Speech & language therapy for children needing extra help, including Talk2Me
- Services for children with blind or low vision needs.

Child Care Enrolment:

OneHSN

The Province of Ontario had municipalities create a central application and registry for all families seeking licensed child care (centre-based, school based and home child care) eliminating the need to contact multiple child care providers and complete multiple applications. If a child care provider is not listed, they are either not licensed under the Child Care Early Years Act (CCEYA) of Ontario, or not an accredited recreation program or do not have a service agreement with your municipality for subsidized child care.
